

## Description

Akihiko undertakes a dangerous journey to China, and in Shanghai learns that what he thought he knew about his father is in fact far from the truth. Here he meets the intriguingly secretive actress Li Xing, who as a pro-democracy activist is herself in danger, and as events gather pace Akihiko's search for his father also becomes a desperate battle to save her from the brutal authorities...

This new translation of a Japanese novelist famed for his creation of suspense and his Hitchcock-style plotting is a rewarding and gripping read.

**Noboru Tsujihara** made his literary debut in 1985 with the novella *Inu kakete (Swear by Dog)*, which was shortlisted for the prestigious Akutagawa Prize. He later won that prize in 1990 with a novella set in the Chinese countryside, *Mura no namae (The Name of the Village)*. In 1999, his first full-length novel *Tobe kirin (Fly, Kylin)* received the Yomiuri Prize for Literature and cemented his reputation as a writer of serious literature. He currently teaches at Tokai University while continuing to write novels, and in 2005 won the Kawabata Prize for *Kareha no nakano aoi honoo (Blue Flame in Withered Leaves)*.

*Juliet W. Carpenter*, a graduate of the University of Michigan, now teaches at Doshisha Women's College of Liberal Arts in Kyoto. During the thirty-plus years that she has spent in Japan, as an award-winning translator she has translated into English a wide array of fiction, non-fiction, essays and poetry by authors including Kobo Abe, Fumiko Enchi, Machi Tawara, Masao Miyamoto and Chuya Nakahara.
