Radio Vox Populi fills a vacancy in the literature concerning key aspects of talk radio in both the Italian context and American context – the models of public, private and community radio; the para-social relationships between radio hosts and their audiences; the ability of radio chatter to enrich and polarize public debate – and how they relate. The book is designed for readers on both sides of the Atlantic, with its cultural comparisons and its analyses of how listeners' relationships with the host influence the hosts' interplay with the passive audience.
